

## ADVENTURE HILL

### Phase 1: Anaheim Ducks Quad Zip Line

Remaining in its previous location, the zip line will be lengthened by approximately 30 feet.

4 lines, doubling the previous capacity. Double the fun!

Take off and landing platforms, both of which will be wheelchair accessible. Platforms will also have a roof, improving the experience for campers and staff.

2 lines will be set as wheelchair accessible.

Cutting edge technology, including “Zip Stop,” magnetic braking technology to comfortably slow zip line riders. This will result in happier campers and an increased throughput. It eliminates rider participation in braking, minimizing the potential for human error.

Ramps and fencing, improving the security and accessibility of the area over the previous zip line.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in mid-April.

Built for youth and adults of all ages and abilities, there is truly nothing else like this in all of Orange County!

### Phase 2: Climbing Wall

Approx. 35 feet (5 feet taller than previous version).

Total height 47 feet, which includes a roof.

8 routes for climbing with various levels of difficulty.

Cutting edge technology, including auto belay system. These auto belays will result in more accessible climbing as well as dramatically reducing staff needs/costs.

Surrounded by a security fence that doubles as a bouldering wall on the inside.

Construction tentatively scheduled for September, dependent upon county permits (height variance being requested to allow for roof).

## Phase 2: Low & High Challenge Course

Pole structure with internal bracing, eliminating the need for guide wires (beneficial due to our small site area).

Approximately 30% will be wheelchair accessible, with an inclined ridged bridge access to upper level.

Approximately 25 activities on upper level, including at least 4 wheelchair accessible activities.

Approximately 20 activities on lower level.

8-Sail roof, in earth tones to blend into our environment.

Construction tentatively scheduled for September.

### By the Numbers

In 2016, there were over 55,000 zips across the Anaheim Ducks zip line! More youth and more groups can be served with an expanded area.

Irvine Ranch Outdoor Education Center current special groups served:

- ♦ 2 weeks of “RAD” Camp (Rising Above Disabilities)
- ♦ 1 week of MDA Camp (Muscular Dystrophy Association)
- ♦ 1 week of Royal Family Camp, local youth who are in foster care
- ♦ 1 week of Camp Kessem, for youth whose parents have cancer
- ♦ 2 weeks of Jr. ROTC High School training camps (Navy & Army)
- ♦ 3 High School Inc Leadership Camps per year
- ♦ 2 Police Exploring Academies
- ♦ Numerous Scout packs, troops and crew each month and there are so many more who want to experience it!

Over 1,300 students took part in our inaugural year of leadership development specific programming in 2017. We have just barely begun to serve this need in our community.

The IROEC’s 10,000 academic students will have an opportunity to experience these areas and this new site will help us increase the number of youth we serve.

Additional scholarships will help us serve more disadvantaged youth.
